

HISTORY

Home From Church


On the back of this c. 1915 photograph is written "Home from Church." It was taken on Vischer Ferry Road near the hamlet of Clifton Park Center (near the present Clifton Park Town Hall). From left to right are: Mae and Lois Clark; their mother, Emeline Pattison Clark; and their brothers, Leicester, John, and George Clark. The family had just arrived home

from Sunday service at the Clifton Park Center Baptist Church. The Clark farmhouse still stands on the west side of Vischer Ferry Road, set a distance from the road, now behind a large new residence that resembles a Spanish

castle. The Clark home was built in about 1820 by Cyrus and Nancy Morehouse Clark, great grandparents of the children in the buggy. Clifton Park's first automobile made its appearance about this time. The Cyrus Clark House was recently added to Clifton Park Register of Historic Places.





A Financial Lesson from Prince

As some of you may have heard, Prince passed away April 21, 2016 at the age of 57. What most of you may not know is he did not have a will in place. According to lawyers it's likely to be a mess that will take years to sort out. While this is unfortunate, it's not unusual since it's estimated that 64% of Americans do not have a will.

So What Happens If I Don't Have a Will?

In absence of a will (dying intestate) each state has a process they follow to determine both what happens to your possessions as well as guardianship for minor children. Because intestacy is settled in court, your heirs may need to endure a costly and long public process that can take up to a year or more in many cases.

How Can I Avoid Probate?

Even with a valid will, your estate will go through the probate process. To avoid this there are three key things you can do:

1. Joint Ownership

When you hold property this way it will pass to surviving co-owners automatically. Joint tenancy can involve any number of people, not only spouses. This may have tax implications so you may want to consult an accountant as well.

2. Trusts

A trust is a legal arrangement under which one person, the trustee, manages property given by another party, the grantor, for the benefit of a third person the beneficiary. Trust property will be distributed according to the terms of the trust without the time, cost and publicity of probate.

3. Contracts

The third way is through beneficiary designation. If you have an employer sponsored retirement plan (i.e., 401k, 403b), an IRA, life insurance or an annuity contract you likely designated a beneficiary when it was opened. The proceeds will automatically pass to whom you selected without the need for probate. They will need to pay any tax due depending on the type of contract.

In closing, if you do not address your estate by creating a will and using some of the techniques discussed, you are deciding to use New York State's process. Discuss this with your financial planner and attorney to create your personal plan.

Be generous, honest, compassionate. Do the right thing. Do good in the world. Follow through. Be accountable. Keep faith. These are all phrases that Kathleen Sanvidge lives by. Instilled in her from day one by her parents, Kathleen strives every day to live up to these words and to pass them on to her own children.

Raised in Clifton Park, Kathleen has been a part of this community all her life. Always a caring person, she knew she wanted to somehow give back to the world. 

Health Tips for Aging Women

CANCER SCREENING – there are various cancer screenings women should have based upon age and risk factors. The American Cancer Society recommends initiating breast cancer screening for women at average risk with mammography at age 45, yearly until age 55, and then every two years thereafter. Other groups endorse routine screening every two years starting

at age 50. Decisions to start screening earlier as well as determining the age to discontinue screening should be individualized. In general, cervical cancer screening continues until age 65 if women have had adequate negative prior screening. Lastly, average risk women should begin colon cancer screening at age 50.

CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE

- as the leading cause of death in women, it is important for women to understand their risks and control factors that may lead to heart disease. These risk factors include high blood pressure, high cholesterol, family history, obesity and smoking. While your family history can't be controlled, the other risk factors can be through lifestyle changes, including healthy eating and physical activity. In some

instances, medications

can be recommended
to manage blood
pressure and
cholesterol. Physical
activity is key
to maintaining
cardiovascular
fitness, bone
health, joint
mobility,
and muscle
strength.

OSTEOPOROSIS SCREENING -

starting at age 65, all women should have bone mineral density testing to assess for bone loss and risk for fractures. Screening should start earlier if a woman has one or more risk factors including family history, cigarette smoking, low body weight, excessive alcohol intake and use of glucocorticoids. The best prevention strategies include weight bearing exercise, adequate calcium and Vitamin D (600-800 IU/day) intake, avoidance of cigarette smoking and limiting alcohol intake.

MENOPAUSE - menopause is defined as a lack of a menstrual period for one year and occurs at a median age of 51. The time leading up to this, perimenopause, or menopausal transition, can last for years. Symptoms include changes in menstrual cycle, hot flashes, sleep and mood disturbances, and vaginal dryness. These symptoms often impact quality of life. I recommend women be open to talking with your gynecologists or primary care providers about treatment options that may be available to them.



This whimsical opera that incorporates dance throughout was composed in collaboration with illustrator and stage designer Beni Montresor, who adapted the libretto from his children's book of the same name. Internationally renowned director and choreographer Karole Armitage, who made her debut with Opera Saratoga last summer leading Dido and Aeneas, returns to direct and choreograph this American premiere production. Viswa Subbaraman, Artistic Director of Skylight Music Theater will conduct.

The final production of the summer opens on July 7th. Based on the Academy Award-winning 1994 Italian film that became a surprise hit with audiences around the world, *Il Postino* tells the story of a shy young postman in a tiny Italian fishing village, who discovers the courage to pursue his dreams through his daily deliveries to his only customer, the esteemed Chilean poet Pablo Neruda.
