



# Forget Me Not, A Personal Quest

Alzheimer's is one of the most mysterious and still incurable diseases since first diagnosed in 1906 by German physician, Alois Alzheimer. This chronic neurodegenerative disease usually starts slowly and progresses over time. This is caused by the buildup of proteins in the brain eventually destroying neurons, or building blocks, in the brain. Alzheimer's is currently affecting 1 in 9 people age 65 and older. So little is known about the cause of this disease, and by the time someone is diagnosed the only solution is medication to slow the progress, not to cure it. Unfortunately, research is a slow progress since most studies are done on cadavers.

This topic is dear to our hearts because my husband and I have experienced two different cases on both sides of our families. My grandmother, Zulmira Sa, began to show symptoms in the early '90s, after a trip to Portugal to mourn the loss of her brother. Upon her return, she brought me a gift, a doll. I noticed that the look in her eye had changed and she was reverting back to when I was a little girl, but of course I was in my 20s. Although still physically

well and strong, I saw a slow deterioration of her mentality. As more time passed, symptoms became more pronounced and finally so obvious that the medication she was taking was no longer effective, and conversations we once had concluded for good. She passed away peacefully in 2001. It is so challenging to try to do the best that you can, but yet, nothing left to be noticed.

My father-in-law, Steve Greenway, is currently a victim of Alzheimer's. His story is a much improved situation than my grandmother's. He was diagnosed in 2004 and immediately became part of a worldwide pharmaceutical study and began taking


the cognition-enhancing medication, Aricept. The fact that he was diagnosed early and quickly began taking medication made all the difference in the world. This helped him with his independence until 2013, when he stopped driving completely after not remembering the way home. Unfortunately, there haven't been any further breakthroughs since then. Lori Jones is a woman on a mission - as a businessperson, community volunteer and most importantly as a Mom. She calls upon that experience to lead our area's effort to bring holiday cheer to children in need. The Southern Saratoga County Chamber Angels, a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit, serves some 2,000 children in conjunction with partners CAPTAIN Youth & Family Services, the Southern Saratoga YMCA, the Mechanicville Area Community Services Center and the Franklin Community Center. Under her leadership, the Angels were recognized as the official local charity for the Fireball Run "Adventurally" TV series, as well as recipient of several corporate grants. Lori shares her thoughts on this important mission:

Q: Please tell us about yourself, your family, business background and how long you have lived in the area.

A: I was born and raised in Niskayuna, studied at Siena College, have lived in Saratoga County (Clifton Park then Stillwater) for 10 years. I now reside in Stillwater with my husband, two children (daughter, age 4 and son, age 1½). I enjoy spending time with family and friends, shopping and dancing. I've been in banking for many years, starting at Trustco Bank from 2002-2007, then moving over to Pioneer Bank until 2012. When my daughter was born I decided to take some time off in order to raise her.

Q: Why are you so passionately involved with the Chamber Angels? How do you feel it makes a difference?

A: When I first got involved, I had no idea how many families in our area were in need of assistance. It was really eye opening. I wanted to be more involved and volunteered to help out as often as I could. This was such a new experience and I

have enjoyed participating every year. The drop-off day when all of the gifts are in the room at the firehouse is amazing to see. It warms my heart to know how many kids are going to wake up on Christmas morning and have presents to open up that they would not otherwise have. And to know that they will go back to school with new clothes and shoes, and a warm winter coat is just awesome.

# Q: ...and you can see joy in the faces of the recipients too, right?

A: When the families pick up their gifts, or have them delivered to them by their schools, you can just see how amazed they are at how many gifts they are being given. They are so appreciative and the heartfelt thank-yous we receive make it all worth it. The program continues to grow and we continue to help more and more families, which is bittersweet. I love that we are able to increase the number of children we help each year, but it is sad to know that there are so many that need our help.

# Q: Please share some experiences you think were especially illustrative of how the Angels performs its mission.

A: The generosity of local businesses and community members is the reason we are able to help hundreds of kids each year. For instance, there was a young mom last year who contacted me around Thanksgiving time, seeking assistance for her 4 children. They had just recently moved to the area and her husband only had part-time work until after the holidays. The school suggested she contact me directly to see if there was any way we could help, even though it was very last minute. The Angels helped out her family and when she came to pick up the gifts, she was so incredibly grateful. She told me she never expected her family to be in that situation and promised that when her they had major electrical problems where they were living and they had to cut in to the wall of her daughter's bedroom to fix the problem. She had the wall patched but didn't have any money to paint her room. The sponsor heard this and bought an extra gift card to Home Depot for the family.

#### Q: You have a special story to share with us from a volunteer counselor, right?

A: Yes, Mary Quinn, a certified school counselor at Shatekon Elementary School, shared that she has worked with the Chamber for about 20 years, at both Shatekon and Chango Elementary Schools. In her words, the Chamber Angels and their sponsors make sure that children are "remembered by Santa", because some of our young children have said that they are not sure if Santa will

# New Treatment for Asthma Patients

#### What is Asthma?

Asthma is characterized by episodes or attacks in which the airways from the mouth and nose to the lungs temporarily become narrow due to a tightening of muscles that surround the bronchial wall and the production of excess mucus. There are many things that trigger asthma attacks, including allergens such as pollen or mold, irritants such as cigarette smoke, exercise and the weather.

Asthma is a chronic respiratory disease that affects about one in 15 Americans (or about 20 million people



in the U.S.), according to the Centers for Disease Control. The number of asthma cases has been on the rise since the early 1980s. Not only can asthma impact your daily life, it can be deadly if not controlled properly.

Ellis Medicine was the first hospital in the Capital Region to offer the bronchial thermoplasty procedure for patients with severe asthma. Bronchial thermoplasty is an FDA-approved treatment for asthma patients over the age of 18 whose asthma is categorized

as "severe persistent" and not well controlled. This clinically proven procedure has been shown to improve quality of life for patients.

In asthmatics, the smooth muscle in the airways is chronically swollen. The bronchial thermoplasty opens the airways by reducing the amount of smooth muscle. Benefits of bronchial thermoplasty:

- Quick return to normal activities
- Improved asthma control
- Less likely to suffer future asthma attacks
- Reduced visits to the emergency room
- Reduced hospitalization for respiratory symptoms
- Fewer missed days from work or school

"This outpatient procedure is performed under moderate sedation, and often takes less than an hour to complete," explained Dr. Brian McDonald, a board certified pulmonologist who performed the first bronchial thermoplasty procedure at Ellis Medicine in 2013. "The procedure heats the lung's airway walls, reducing some of the extra muscle present, allowing the airways to stay open and help the patient breathe better."

David Giardono of Schenectady was the first patient to have the bronchial thermoplasty procedure at Ellis. "I'm looking forward to doing the activities I've had to avoid since being diagnosed with asthma a decade ago," said Giardono.

The procedure is performed with a long tube with a camera that navigates the airways. It sends radio waves to heat and remove smooth muscle. The procedure is typically completed in three sessions and lasts about 35 to 40 minutes under general anesthesia.

"The procedure will enable people to live more actively," said Dr. McDonald. "It offers hope for those who suffer from severe asthma."



# Shenendehowa Area Cub Scouts Perform Pinewood Derby Experiment

Clifton Park Cub Scout Pack 45 recently hosted a STEM event open to all Cub Scouts in the Shenendehowa school district at the Shenendehowa United Methodist Church. Scouts from Clifton Park Packs 42, 43, 44 & 45 ran an experiment to see which common design features of a Pinewood Derby® car could be proven to actually make the car go faster. The design parameters were Car Shape, Weight, Added Weight Placement Location, and Wheel Base Length. Sixteen cars were created with the different options so that the scouts created a full factorial statistical design. The cars were randomly raced against each other with each car racing once on each track.

The Scouts overwhelmingly voiced their opinion that weight and weight placement on the rear axle were very important in making the car go faster, and they were able to draw several other conclusions from the day's experiment. They also found some results that prompted them to consider a new future experiment as well. Mr. Gersey from Pack 45 and Mr. Vanden Berg from Pack 44 plan to complete the analysis of the results and compile the findings in an instructional narrative for other Packs to use as a STEM learning tool.

The district-wide Bountiful Backpack Program is a partnership with the Regional Food Bank of NENY that is designed to meet the needs of hungry children at times when other resources are not available, especially on weekends. The program provides a backpack filled with food that is child-

friendly, shelf-stable, and easilyconsumed. Bags are packed each week by volunteers and



discreetly distributed by school staff to participating children every Friday afternoon.

#### Each bag includes:

- 2 breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal packets, graham crackers, granola bars)
- 3 entrées (mac & cheese, PB & J, SpaghettiOs, tuna fish, soup)
- 2 juice boxes (100% juice)
- Milk card for 1 gallon of milk




# The Elnora Train Station

This photo is of the railroad station and freight depot in Elnora about 1900. Elnora was an important freight depot on the D&H Railroad. Molasses arrived for Smith's Grain and Feed Store, and molding sand was loaded on the train for shipment to foundries. Mr. C. D. Hammond, supervisor of the D&H Railroad, named the community Elnora,


