# ALL ABOUT EYES Ask an Ophthalmologist

#### Q. Why does my eye exam take so much time?

**A.** If your eye exam is taking more than an hour, you're most likely having a dilated eye exam. During your dilated eye exam, both of your eyes will be inspected for any signs of vision problems and/or eye diseases such as glaucoma, macular degeneration, diabetic eye disease and cataracts. The view to the back of the eye is limited when the pupil is not dilated, so the dilated eye exam is a very important part of preventive eye care.

In order to dilate your eyes, we use special drops. The dilation eye drops may take approximately 15-30 minutes to begin working. However, if a patient has a serious eye disease, such as glaucoma, and is taking medication, their eyes may take up to an hour to dilate.

Once your pupils are dilated, your eye doctor will then look in with a bright light and use special instruments to see various parts of the eye. You'll be asked to look up, down, left and right while the exam is being performed.



This allows your eye doctor to see completely inside your eye including the macula, retina, blood vessels and optic nerve.

Whether you need to have a dilated eye exam depends on your age and your health. If you have diabetes, it is especially important to have an annual dilated exam. We recommend most adults have a dilated eye exam every year in order to detect and treat eye conditions that could potentially lead to vision loss.







CAPTAIN Community Human Services Recipient of \$10,000 Donation

The Real Story Is the One Behind the Donor

CAPTAIN Community Human Services, a non-profit grassroots human services organization in Saratoga County that supports and empowers people of all ages to reach their goals of personal growth and self-sufficiency, received a \$10,000 donation at the end of December from the Zachary Culnan Memorial Family Fund.

CAPTAIN received a call in the summer of 2017 from Sean Culnan, a Sand Lake resident who owns Culnan Insurance Agency, LLC. His son, Zachary, had passed away two years prior at the age of 21 from a heroin overdose, and Sean and his wife, Kim, felt that for them to start healing, they needed to help others.

Heroin is a national epidemic. Culnan believes that his son turned to drugs as an answer to an underlying anxiety that went unrecognized. "We need to get to the young adults before they have the opportunity to get involved with drugs," he states. "I feel

they pursue drugs because they don't feel good about themselves. We need to empower them and make them feel good about themselves. Empower them now, because once they get entangled in drugs, we may never get them back."

Culnan doesn't live in Saratoga County, but when he learned about CAPTAIN's programs and services, especially with regard to youth, he knew that CAPTAIN was who he wanted to work with. Through CAPTAIN, Culnan will be a mentor to certain youth in CAPTAIN's runaway and homeless youth shelter, street outreach program and at the outreach center, Cheryl's Lodge.

"As an adult," Culnan continued, "I really feel we all have a responsibility to our teenagers and young adults to provide guidance. I do not think anyone with any success in anything has not achieved their success without a mentor providing that

guidance. Success does not have to be financial success; a greater success is being empowered to feel they can accomplish anything they choose to pursue. I want to help the young adults involved with CAPTAIN to feel that sense of empowerment."

Another way Culnan can empower youth is through powerlifting: "They set a goal and they achieve it," he shared. Culnan is highly respected in the powerlifting community, having won numerous competitions over the 30 years he's been involved in the sport and at one time, being ranked in the top five powerlifters in the world. For his 50th birthday, he organized Culnan's King of the Deadlift fundraiser, hoping to raise \$3,000 to donate to CAPTAIN. Attesting to how many people have rallied around him and his family, the event raised \$10,000.

Sue Catroppa, CAPTAIN's
Executive Director, said, "We were
so moved by Sean's passion – for his
son, for his family and the impact
that powerlifting has had on his life.
That he chose CAPTAIN to connect
with will be meaningful for both of
us. He and his family can know that
they're making a huge impact in the
community, not only financially, but
by connecting with youth before
they make a poor decision that could
forever change or end their life."
